## Scholarly Engagement Policy Online Doctoral Students (Ed.D.) Updated March 2023

The goal of the Scholarly Engagement requirement is to prepare doctoral graduates who can acquire, evaluate, communicate, extend, and apply knowledge through active participation in the scholarly practitioner community.

Annual Confirmation of Scholarly Engagement. Each year, as part of the annual review process, doctoral students must demonstrate to their major professor's satisfaction either 1) completion of any benchmark activity or 2) concrete progress toward the completion of any benchmark activity. Students will submit a Scholarly Engagement Narrative in the EdD Student Portal at the end of the spring term each year.

**Prerequisites to be completed before key milestones in doctoral progression**: Certain benchmarks must be completed before the end of Years 1 and 2 and prior to graduation.

#### BENCHMARKS FOR SCHOLARLY ENGAGEMENT

## **During Year 1**

- Develop a resumé or CV
- Complete the CITI human subjects training (to be completed in EDF6486)

And at least one of the following:

- Attend a professional development conference/meeting or
- Attend/watch at least 2 Relevant Research Roundtable (R3) presentations

### **During Year 2**

Updated resumé or CV

And at least one of the following:

- Attend at least 1 state, regional, or national conference (professional or research association)
- Attend/watch an FSU professional development seminar/workshop

#### **Before Graduation**

Updated resumé or CV

And at least one of the following:

- Present the results of your DiP to key decisionmakers and stakeholders in your local context
- Present at a national, state, regional, or local conference/professional development Seminar or
- Submit an article to a professional organization newsletter and/or journal



## Scholarly Engagement Policy Face to Face Doctoral Students (Ed.D & Ph.D.) Updated March 2023

**Purpose:** The goal of the Scholarly Engagement requirement is to prepare doctoral graduates to become lifelong participants and contributors to the scholarly community and to become active scholars, who acquire, critically evaluate, and create new knowledge and disseminate their work. Students should consult with their major professor at the start of the academic year to develop a plan for scholarly engagement for that year.

Confirmation of Scholarly Engagement: Each year, as part of the annual review process, doctoral students must demonstrate their scholarly engagement activity to their faculty advisor. This process will be facilitated by the use of the ELPS Scholarly Engagement Activities Canvas site.

#### ILLUSTRATIVE SUGGESTIONS FOR SCHOLARLY ENGAGEMENT:

## Pre-Diagnostic/Diagnostic Exam

- Join and attend LEARN events and activities
- Establish a POS approved by the advisor and two other ELP faculty members
- Attend the Marvalene Hughes Conference hosted by the COE
- Attend R3 Relevant Research Roundtable hosted by the department
- Develop a Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- Engage your major professor as well as other faculty members on topics, ideas of interest, etc.
- Attend the Program for Instructional Excellence (PIE) Teaching Conference, mandatory for all Teaching Assistants (by end of first year) <a href="https://pie.fsu.edu/prepare-teach">https://pie.fsu.edu/prepare-teach</a>

### Pre-Prospectus/Proposal Defense

- Continue the above activities
- Update CV
- Attend at least one prospectus defense as an observer
- Attend at least one of the following:
  - o a national conference/professional or research association
  - o a methodological workshop (IES sponsored workshops; professional associations such as AERA)
  - o an FSU professional development seminar/workshop

#### **Pre-Dissertation Defense**

- Continue the above activities
- Update CV
- Attend at least one dissertation defense as an observer
- Present at R3
- Present as first or second author/presenter at a national conference
- Present as the first or second author/presenter at a state or regional conference
- Publish an article as the first/second author in a peer-review journal (article accepted or "in press" by the time of graduation)
