The APA Commission on Accreditation requires that doctoral programs in professional psychology to report on the number and percentage of program graduates who have become licensed psychologists within the preceding decade (minus the two most recent years). As can be seen from the table above, 88% of graduates from 2013-20223 have become licensed. A small percent of graduates reported that they are not licensed and have not pursued licensure because they do not require it for their job (e.g., a school psychology position which requires school psychology certification but not licensure as a psychologist or an academic faculty position).
