Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grants The <u>TEACH Grant</u> program provides grants up to \$4,000 annually to students who commit to teaching in select high-need subject areas in public or private elementary or secondary schools that serve low income families. Florida Bright Futures Scholarship A Bright Futures scholarship recipient, who graduates with a BS degree in seven or fewer semesters, or in 105 semester hours or fewer, may receive funding for one semester of graduate study, not to exceed 15 credit hours paid at the undergraduate rate. Students are eligible for maximum of 120 semester hours (or equivalent) toward the completion of a first baccalaureate degree. Florida Pre-Paid Florida Pre-Paid benefits may be applied toward the cost of graduate courses. If eligible, the plan will pay the average in-state undergraduate rate per credit hour for these courses. Any remaining cost will be the responsibility of the student. Florida Student Assistance Grant Program The <u>Florida Student Assistance Grant (FSAG</u>) is a state funded need-based award program offering grants to first degree seeking undergraduate students attending public Florida institutions. Awards range from \$200-\$2610 per academic year, based on the availability of funds.	Yes	No		
First Generation Matching Grant (CARE Program) The First-Generation Matching Grant (FGEN) is a need-based award program offering grants to first degree seeking undergraduate students whose parents have not earned a bachelor's degree. Awards range from \$200 to \$3,000 per academic year based on the availability of funds.	Yes	No		
FFMT Minority Teacher Education Scholarship The annual award is \$4,000 for a maximum of two years (\$8,000). Students may request an extension to cover the graduate year. The total amount of this award is a 100% reduction (waiver) of the out-of-state portion of tuition.
